<b>Affinity Bloc</b>	People groups in the CPPI database are broadly grouped into 12 blocs with affinities based on language, culture, and ethnicity.	HIS Harvest Information System	Public	Monthly
<b>People Cluster</b>	Within each Affinity Bloc are people clusters; groupings of people whose relationships are often based on a common identity of language and name but sometimes on the basis of culture, religion, economy, or dominance of one group over another. The GRI is comprised of 20 measures of restrictions, including efforts by governments to ban particular faiths, prohibit conversions, limit preaching or give preferential treatment to one or more religious groups. <b>Social Hostilities Index</b>	The Social Hostilities Index (SHI) measures acts of religious hostility by private individuals, organizations and social groups. This includes mob or sectarian violence, harassment over attire for religious reasons and other religion-related intimidation or abuse. The SHI includes 13 measures of social hostilities. <b>IMB Affinity Group</b>	Affinity Groups bring together people groups that share a commonality of language, culture, and ethnicity regardless of their geographical locations.
